Community Development Training Program (CDTP):

- 6 communities
- 12 trainees
- 12 workshops
- 12 internships
- 6 locally assessed and adopted community development strategies
- 6 latvian local case studies (training diary)
- 1 handbook
- 1 national community development strategy
- 1 international conference on community development
- 1 Training program



6 communities, most possibly one from each planning region of Latvia: Kurzeme, Latgale, Riga, Vidzeme and Zemgale, as well as Riga's City.

Each community represents best possibly a certain community typology: Water, inland, rural, industrial/post-industrial, small or bigger scale, regional center, city-district, ...

The communities will be suggested by the project partners. Starting with April 1. the communities will be invited to participate in the program and on April 16. a public information meeting will be arranged with all interested communities. Afterwards the participating communities will apply and latest by Mid May selected by the steering committee of the training program.

12 Trainees:

Each community delegates two prospective community activists for the training program. The trainees are running the training program as pairs. Participation is obligatory at all times.



12 Local workshops:

Generally each community hosts twice a workshop, one in the first sequence of 6 workshops and after the internship and community assessment break a second one in the second sequence of workshops.

Within the break of the two workshop sequences the trainees have to hold an internship of approx. 2-3 weeks at their municipal or regional institution.

6 Local results:

Overall principle: Planning for Real! Each community elaborates a participative locally assessed and adopted community development strategy.

With the experiences and the results of all communities we'll receive a synoptical and ideal Latvian local case study (6 diaries).

Monitoring and evaluation:

All measures and working steps will be scientifically monitored and evaluated.



1 Education program and handbook:

The lecture material and the experiences as well as the case studies (local diaries) will be conducted and edited as a handbook on community engagement and development.

This handbook will serve further on as an education guideline and material for further community development education programs.

1 National community development strategy:

All experiences and results will be summarized in a national strategic community development document and serve as suggestion for further policies.

1 International conference on community development:

Results as well as the education program will be evaluated and discussed during an international symposium on community development.
