

Stocktaking for Latvian case is finalised. Now BEF-LV conducts ongoing analysis. Focus on landscapes. Landscape biophysical landscape assessment used 6 criteria and indicators corresponding to each criteria. There was one stakeholder workshop in Liepāja in October 9 2019 with expert and stakeholder involvement. The interim results were presented in Coastal coordination group meeting on 16.10.2019. and at 2 scientific conferences. BEF-LV will continue to use survey and online tools to reach more people.

BEF-LV planned meeting with stakeholders in April, but due to COVID-19 it is not possible. We will look for solutions.

GR analyses the interviews with 130 small and medium sized maritime businesses. Focus on most important markets and networks, supply of competence, local cooperation and dependence, future need for space and facilities, future development. Most important markets - mostly local and national. Big issue- experienced staff. Most companies have to train their stuff themselves. Lack of people with formal education. Gothenburg region lacks places or platforms to discuss issues like Climate adaptation.

Further steps:

- Workshops with stakeholders basis in interview study and existing strategies.
- Information meeting for municipality representative.
- Telling results online.
- Preparing tutorial for proactive planning.

Comparing Case studies is challenging. To bring out the synthesis, how to combine them together. Land-Sea interaction and Blue Growth are the main themes. Idea for comparison: 1-2 wider concepts to look at. One is scale in multilevel governance. Methods could described more in Compendium of methods (A.2.1).

The second chapter of the report could be on Scales and addressed tensions (conflicts) in MLG in cases.

The third chapter could be the reflections on the application by the demonstration cases.

We should look also on replication possiblity of measures in other countries.

TLU can think about the time schedule on A4.2. and share it later in the email with the partners, to see better, how we go in the direction of results.

Multi-level governance agenda will be structured according to Main thematic actions in MLG Agenda:

- 1. Enhancement of Blue Growth(coastal tourism, blue energy, including offshore wind, blue biotechnology, seabed mining),
- 2. **Spatial planning** (MSP, land-based & integrated planning)
- 3. Climate change adaptation

The thematic actions will have recommendations for each governance level:

- transnational
- national
- regional
- local (including community level).



Levels represented, mostly – Local and national.

Kristīna Veidemane (BEF-LV): Objective – panel provides input for project and its main output Multi-level governance agenda on Blue Growth and Spatial Planning in BSR. Expert panel meeting are planned in: Holbaek, Gothenburg, Riga, Hamburg. Additional online meetings and written communication is possible. Expert panel has more than 1 year work ahead. Outcome (output) of our project – Policy brief with key messages and recommendations for development of MLG Agenda for spatial planning and Blue Growth.

Expert suggestions from the discussion on what Multi-level Governance (MLG) Agenda should look at:

Ināra Stalidzāne (Carnikava municipality, LV): It would be good to have a result a presentation with **best experiences** of businesses and linking it together with legislation that allowed them to go this way.

Jacek Zaucha (IOPAN, Poland): Interesting question is how the situation on the sea influence development on Land. How it will influence small municipalities dependent on tourism. Second issue is complex approach - Blue Growth will be more complex, cover more issues, not just one sector (tourism).

Andrea Morf (Sweden, ICES): It is important to look on **education**. Maybe you should **target specific stakeholders** / target groups.

Elīna Veidemane (VASAB secretariat): **Targeted messages for different players could be distinguished.** VASAB has preparation for the new MSP roadmap and VASAB long term perspective (LTP) after 2020 where ideas from this project Land-Sea-Act could be integrated.

Kristīna Veidemane (BEF-LV): MLG Agenda should bring all levels together.

Steen Schønemann (Holbaek municipality, Denmark): We should see the **crucial problems**, we should look for appropriate **solutions** how to solve them.

Andrea Morf (Sweden, ICES): Important are obstacles to Blue Growth.

Jacek Zaucha (IOPAN, Poland): I cannot see the multi-level governance. We are focusing on local experience etc, I do not see multi-level governance. If you want to come up with policy brief, we should see how cooperation works. I think that world will be different after this Corona virus. Tourism industry will be affected, less tourists from other countries.

Ināra Stalidzāne (Carnikava municipality, LV): MLG is difficult thing. When we come down to concrete problems, then thinking starts to be sectoral. **How to implement the plans** it is the question.

Marta Czarnecka Gallas (ZMIGM, Poland): **Education and capacity building** is very important for municipalities (in Poland). I took part ZMIGM local municipalities meeting. Most municipalities do not have opportunity to have practices, cross-border exchange.

Anne Nummela (Regional Council of Satakunta, Finland): **How can MSP can help to enhance Blue Growth**. What role MSP will have in future?

Tiina Tihlamn (Ministry of the Environment, Finland): How to enforce MSP (on municipalities).

Anne Nummela (Regional Council of Satakunta, Finland): On Regional level we plan on long perspective. Municipalities work more wih short term issues. And issues can happen quickly. They have to respond quickly.


Kristīna Veidemane (BEF-LV): Time dimension makes difference between planning levels.

Anna Aldegren (Tjörns municipality, Sweden): The conflict between regional planning and municipalities can be divided in 2 parts. Long term planning needs actions that are not popular for local politicians and they could be afraid to take action. But locals also have different knowledge. Both should have more respect towards each other.
